# **Introduction:**

Established in 1951, the Jesuit Chennai Province, based in Chennai, India, is dedicated to promoting education, social justice, and interfaith dialogue. Echoing Robert Greene's insight, "The future belongs to those who learn more skills and combine them in creative ways," the Province actively addresses social issues, including women, education, health, Tribals, migrants, and skill development. The AHAL (Action for Human Rights and Liberation) Centre, founded in 1999, operates under the Province's vision, focusing on empowering Dalits, particularly the Arunthathiyars, combating poverty and exclusion in northern Tamil Nadu.

AHAL Centre, a beacon of the Province's commitment, has a successful track record of empowering Arunthathiyar women through employable skills, contributing to their economic independence and social upliftment. To expand this impact, additional funds are needed for comprehensive skill development programs, training, resources, and support services. AHAL Centre exemplifies this ethos by conducting classes directly in target villages, ensuring accessibility.

AHAL ensures success by procuring essential resources for skill development, including tailoring machines and computers. Meticulously chosen trainers collaborate with the Centre Staff to identify villages with urgent needs. The Centre prioritizes deserving students, such as dropouts, housewives, widows, aligning seamlessly with the broader mission of the Jesuit Chennai Province.

AHAL's commitment to empowering individuals aligns seamlessly with the Province's vision of a future shaped by creative and skillful individuals. The Centre plays a pivotal role in realizing this vision by significantly contributing to skill development, embodying the Province's holistic approach to social action.

#### **Problem Statement:**

The Arunthathiyar women in the Thiruvannamalai and Villupuram districts of Northern Tamil Nadu are grappling with multifaceted challenges that hinder their progress. High unemployment rates, limited educational opportunities, financial dependence, and social discrimination collectively form barriers to their economic empowerment and social upliftment. This situation underscores the pressing need for a targeted intervention to address the root causes of these challenges.

The proposed project seeks to empower Arunthathiyar women by providing tailored training in tailoring and computer skills. These skills are carefully chosen to offer practical and marketable expertise, enabling the women to secure employment or establish their own small-scale businesses. The overarching objective is to break the cycle of poverty, financial dependence, and social discrimination that currently defines their lives.

At the core of the issue is the lack of access to education and skill development, which perpetuates a state of economic vulnerability. The project aims to equip Arunthathiyar women with the tools necessary to secure stable income, thereby improving their living conditions. By doing so, the project endeavours to uplift not only individual women but also their families and communities.

Through this initiative, the project aims to instill a sense of economic self-reliance among Arunthathiyar women. This self-reliance not only addresses immediate financial needs but also contributes to enhanced self-esteem and improved social standing. By breaking down the barriers that restrict these women, the project aspires to create a positive and lasting impact on their lives, fostering a more equitable and inclusive society in the Thiruvannamalai and Villupuram districts of Northern Tamil Nadu.

# **Objectives:**

- ➤ To provide tailoring and computer skills training to 120 Arunthathiyar women (60 computer & 60 Tailoring)
- > To support the establishment of self-employment ventures for 50% of the trained women
- > To facilitate employment opportunities for the remaining 50% of the trained women

# **Activities:**

# 1. Inauguration:

The AHAL Skill Development Centre marked a significant milestone on November 20 with the inauguration of a tailoring centre and a computer centre at Nallan Pillai Petral. This initiative was made possible through the approval of a budget by ZF Hero Chassis Systems Private Limited (CSR Initiatives). The inaugural function was graced by esteemed guests, including Mr. G. Chandramouli, Plant Head (General Manager), Dr. M. Irudhayaraj, Head HR, and Mr. K. Gopinath, Safety Head. The event witnessed the enthusiastic participation of 74 students in the tailoring courses and 64 students in the computer courses. This inauguration not only symbolizes the expansion of AHAL's

reach but also underscores the vital partnership with ZF Hero Chassis Systems Private Limited in promoting skill development and empowerment within the community.

# 2. Tailoring and Computer Classes:

At the AHAL Skill Development Centre, our tailored curriculum for the October 2023 to March 2024 period spans two key courses: Sewing Machine Operator (SMO) for tailoring and Associate Desktop Publishing (DTP) for computer skills. Operating from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm daily, we follow the syllabus recommended by the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) under Skill India 2015. With the support of the Indian Centre for Research and Development of Community Education (ICRDCE), a registered NSDC partner, our centre is committed to delivering high-quality training. Under the guidance of Rev. Fr. Xavier Alphonse SJ, the Director and Founder of ICRDCE, the computer course covers essential software applications, while the tailoring course focuses on a range of practical skills, including embroidering and garment stitching. Furthermore, we prioritize holistic development by incorporating life coping skills training into our daily schedule, with dedicated sessions thrice a week led by trained staff. This holistic approach ensures that our students not only acquire technical expertise but also develop essential life skills, contributing to their overall personal and professional growth.

# 3. Workshop on employment opportunities and Marketing and Finance:

On the 16th of December, a collaborative effort between Loyola Institute of Business Administration, Chennai, and the AHAL Centre culminated in a workshop focusing on Employment Opportunities, Entrepreneurial Initiatives, and Marketing. The event, hosted at the AHAL Centre, witnessed active participation from students enrolled in both the Computer and Tailoring courses. This initiative underscores our commitment to providing comprehensive education, ensuring that students are not only equipped with technical skills but also gain insights into real-world employment prospects and entrepreneurial avenues. The workshop served as a platform for students to explore and understand the dynamic intersections of their respective fields in the broader business landscape.

# 4. Exposure Visit:

On the 27th of January, the staff and students of the AHAL Skill Development Centre embarked on a valuable exposure program by attending South India's Biggest Business Conclave & Exhibition for SC/ST entrepreneurs at the Chennai Trade Centre. This enriching experience provided a platform for over 350 exhibitors to showcase their diverse range of products, featuring over 5000 items on display. The event drew more than 2000 visitors, creating a dynamic environment for networking and learning. This initiative aligns with our commitment to offering holistic education, ensuring that our students gain practical insights into the broader business landscape and fostering a spirit of entrepreneurship among them.

# 5. Staff Capacitation:

The tailoring and computer staff of our center recently participated in a capacitation program organized by Loyola Institute of Business Administration (LIBA) at Dhyana Ashram. This initiative aimed to enhance their skills in tailoring techniques, computer education, and teaching methodologies. The program reflects our commitment to

continuous improvement and ensuring our staff remains at the forefront of educational practices, ultimately benefiting the students at our center.

# 6. Valedictory Programme:

On January 18, 2024, the AHAL Skill Development Centre held its Convocation Day, a momentous occasion that not only acknowledged the academic accomplishments but significantly boosted the confidence of our students. A total of 64 students received certification for completing the basic computer course (ADTP), while 74 students earned recognition as certified tailors through the completion of the SMO course. The esteemed presence of Chief Guests, including Rev. Fr. Ilanko Xavier, and other notable figures, added to the celebratory atmosphere. This event marked more than just the receipt of certificates; it was a transformative experience that instilled a sense of achievement akin to receiving a degree, empowering our students as they venture into new professional endeavours with heightened confidence.

# **OUTCOME OF THE PROJECT:**

- ➤ Enhanced Technical Skills: Trained Arunthathiyar women have acquired proficiency in tailoring and computer skills, positioning them for employment or self-employment opportunities in these fields.
- ➤ **Increased Employability**: The project has significantly improved the employability of Arunthathiyar women. 50% of participants have successfully established their own self-employment ventures, while the remaining 50% secured employment opportunities.
- ➤ Entrepreneurial Knowledge: Participants gained valuable knowledge and skills in entrepreneurship and marketing, empowering them to manage businesses effectively, attract customers, and generate sustainable income.
- ➤ Improved Livelihoods: The project has resulted in improved livelihoods for trained women, enabling them to generate income through self-employment or secure employment opportunities. This has led to increased financial stability and better living conditions for them and their families.
- ➤ Increased Financial Independence: Through self-employment ventures and employment opportunities, the project has contributed to the financial independence of Arunthathiyar women, reducing reliance on external sources and empowering them to make financial decisions for themselves and their families.
- ➤ Social Recognition: The project elevated the social status of Arunthathiyar women by providing opportunities to showcase their skills and contributions. This challenges social stigma and discrimination, gaining recognition within their communities.
